# A. Current Synopsis:

- The Governor issued Executive Order 103 Declaring a State of Emergency. Please read here <a href="https://nj.gov/infobank/eo/056murphy/pdf/EO-103.pdf">https://nj.gov/infobank/eo/056murphy/pdf/EO-103.pdf</a>
- President Trump declared a nationwide emergency pursuant to Sec. 501 (b) of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (the "Stafford Act). This increases federal support to the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) in its role as the lead federal agency for the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic response. As a result of the President's action, FEMA has been directed to assist state and local governments and other eligible entities with the health and safety actions they take on behalf of the American public. - The State Corona Virus Task Force continues to lead the COVID-19 response.
- The State Emergency Operations Center, (609) 963-6900 daily hours and levels are listed below:
  - o 0800 and 1600 hours, Full Activation Level 1- contact SEOC at Ext 2.
  - o 1600 and 0800 hours, Enhanced Monitoring Level 3-contact IWW at Ext 1.
- Governor Murphy continues to recommend cancelling all public gatherings of 250 people or more.
- As of March 13, 2020 at 1600hrs, 400 school districts have closed, 148 are for professional development and staff training, 15 are for precautionary cleaning, 154 are concerned about potential exposure for COVID-19, 80 have confirmed exposure within the school community and 3 have student, faculty or staff with presumptive or confirmed positive cases. https://www.nj.gov/education/topics/index.shtml

• Officials with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention have announced that China, Iran, South Korea, and several countries in Europe are experiencing widespread sustained transmission of respiratory illness caused by the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) and have placed these countries to Warning - Level 3. Please be advised that all employees who are returning from the China, Iran, South Korea and the following European countries will be required to stay home for the recommended 14 days and monitor their health in the interest of their safety and the safety of their coworkers: Belgium, Iceland, Poland, Vatican City, Czech Republic, Italy, Portugal, Denmark, Latvia, Slovakia, Estonia, Liechtenstein, Slovenia, Finland, Lithuania, Spain, Austria, Hungary, Norway, San Marino, France, Luxembourg, Sweden, Germany, Malta, Switzerland, Greece, Netherlands and Monaco.



o ESF #1 - Transportation - NJ Transit has launched a dedicate web page offering a centralized location to highlight the many initiatives the agency has undertaken to protect customers and employees against COVID-19. The web page, <a href="njtransit.com/COVID19">njtransit.com/COVID19</a>, is available on both desktop and through the mobile app. In addition to outlining the steps the agency has taken, the website also includes a Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) section. Posters reminding customers of best-practices to prevent the spread of germs will be appearing on NJ TRANSIT vehicles throughout the system in the coming days.

- ESF#7 Resource Support the probability of CERT activations remains high. Potential activations include but are not limited to staffing local OEMs (fielding 211 calls) and additional responsibilities to include food deliveries for those who are homebound. All county CERT groups have been notified through the county contacts and have advised them to begin making the appropriate preparations.
- ESF#8 NJDOH Daily information and guidance regarding COVID-19 has been sent to County and Local Public Health Offices via the NJLINCS HEALTH ALERT NETWORK. OEM and Public Health are strongly encourage to communicate and coordinate efforts. NJDOH and the NJ Hospital Association are communicating with and encouraging healthcare facilities to communicate with and coordinate efforts with their respective County and Local OEM. ESF8 continues to coordinate response efforts with their respective SEMPS partners from information, guidance and resources as they arise. Guidance on PPE use, handling of decedent remains and other emerging issues continue to be distributed. to be tested. Individuals with MILD symptoms should stay home if they are sick and follow the guidance of their healthcare provider
